## **Dress Code Policy**

Lansing Elementary does not have a school uniform policy. We do have a dress code policy because the way a student dresses has an impact on his/her attitude and behavior at school. Clothing should be safe and not cause distractions to others.

Skirts/Shorts should be longer than the tip of our fingers as our hands hang at our sides.

No sagging. Pants are to be pulled up high enough that our stomachs are not showing.

No spaghetti straps, tank tops, mesh tops or tube tops.

No sheer or see through tops.

No hats, rags, or head scarves are to be worn inside the building. (Head coverings worn for religious reasons are allowed).

No clothing with inappropriate words or pictures on them.

No sheer or see through material.

No undergarments should be visible.

No flip flops. We also suggest that students avoid wearing open-toed sandals/shoes to prevent toe injuries

The administration and staff maintain the authority to determine appropriate clothing for school. Students who fail to dress appropriately will be required to change. Repeat dress code violations may result in a behavior report or suspension.

## **Política de Código de Vestido**

Lansing Elementary no tiene una política de uniforme escolar. No obstante, si tenemos una política sobre vestimenta escolar porque la manera que viste el estudiante afecta su actitud y comportamiento en la escuela. La ropa tiene que tener un diseño seguro y no causar distracción a otros.

Faldas/Pantalones cortos deben de ser más largos que la punta de nuestros dedos cuando los brazos cuelguen a nuestros lados.

No se permite pantalón caído; los pantalones deben de estar a una altura donde no esté visible el estómago.

No se permiten blusas con tirantes estrechos (tipo espagueti); ni camisetas sin mangas, ni camisetas de rejilla ni blusa ceñida sin tirantes.

No se permiten blusas de material fino o transparente.

No se permiten sombreros, cachuchas, paliacates o pañuelos mientras estén en las instalaciones. (Si se permite el uso de pañoletas por razones religiosas).

No se permite vestimenta que lleve palabras, frases o dibujos inapropiados.

No se permite vestimenta de material fino o transparente.

La ropa interior no puede estar visible.

No se permiten chanclas. También sugerimos que los estudiantes eviten calzar sandalia/zapatos con punta descubierta para evitar posibles accidentes que dañen los dedos del pie.

La administración y el personal tienen plena autoridad para determinar la vestimenta escolar apropiada. Aquellos estudiantes que no vistan de manera apropiada se les pedirán que se cambien de ropa. Repetidas infracciones del código de vestimenta escolar pueden resultar en un reporte sobre comportamiento o en una expulsión temporal.

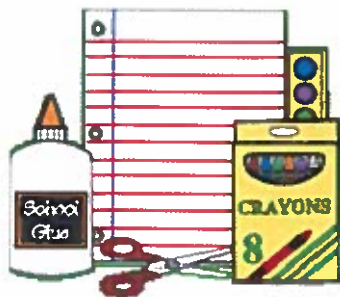

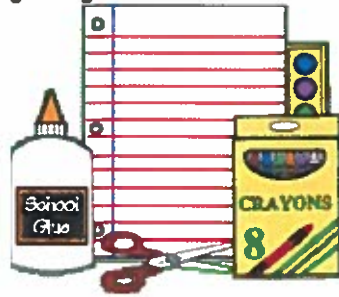
